Per Wikipedia: Music and lyrics by Gerald Marks and Seymour Simons. "All of Me" first came to public awareness when a performance by Belle Baker was broadcast over the radio in 1931. A recording on December 1 that year by Paul Whiteman and His Orchestra, with vocalist Mildred Bailey went to the top of the US pop charts. Within weeks, another two versions were in the charts, with a Louis Armstrong rendition also reaching No. 1. The definitive version was sung by Billie Holiday in 1941. Willie Nelson's version reached No. 3 on the Hot Country Songs chart in 1978. In 2000, "All of Me" was given the Towering Song Award by the Songwriters Hall of Fame.
